

Event Preview

MSPT153 AT JACK CLEVELAND CASINO BOASTS \$300K GTD AUGUST 1-4

ASthe MSPT clears the halfway point in Season 10, it's time to look ahead to MSPT153 at JACK Cleveland Casino in Cleveland, OH—a 21 or older event.

The \$1,100 buyin, \$300K GTD Main Event will take place August 1-4 and will

be preceded by a series of \$70, \$145 and \$265 satellites where every single satellite boasts a 10-seat guarantee! The stop will mark the MSPT's 153rd Main Event but just the third ever at JACK Cleveland Casino.

In 2018, the inaugural MSPT Cleveland Poker Open attracted 581 entrants and saw Abdul "Dulie" Amer, a good friend of poker pros Adam Friedman and Nick Guagenti, capture the title and \$118,350 first-place prize.

Fast forward to January 2019 where the MSPT JACK Cleveland Casino event attracted 725-runners creating a prize pool over \$700K making it by far the largest major poker tournament (\$1K+ buy-in) in Cleveland's history, breaking our own record from the previous year. In the end, it was Sean Munjal of Ann Arbor, Michigan, who navigated the field to take down a \$140,654 first-place prize.

The property, which is open 24/7, is a 300,000-square-foot complex—96,000 square feet are dedicated to gaming including slot machines, table games, and poker—the property is located inside the historic Higbee Building on Public Square, which is adjacent to the city's entertainment district.

The casino, which is within minutes of Quicken Loans Arena, the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, and FirstEnergy Stadium, offers 1,600 slots with denominations from 1 cent all the way up to \$500 per spin, as well as nearly 100 table games including Blackjack, Craps, Roulette, and several poker variants. In addition, poker players can grind it out in the 30-table poker room, which hosts games (hold'em, Omaha, 7-Card Stud, and Razz are all offered) around the clock.

JACK Cleveland Casino also has you covered for parking as players may either valet or self-park at the casino's dedicated 1,300-space parking structure located at the corner of Ontario and Prospect streets. K Level card holders park for free, while other ClubJACK members park free based on rated play

While you're at JACK Cleveland, you can choose from several dining options including a buffet restaurant, three quick-serve food outlets, and three feature bars. In addition, Boston-based burger-chain, Wahlburgers, is located in retail space adjacent to the casino parking structure.

Speaking of those three casino bars, they all offer premium spirits, cocktails, beers, and wines. Additionally, Rock Bar & Lounge offers 35 flat-screen TVs and the area's only electronic table games.

In its first three years, JACK Cleveland Casino welcomed more than 13 million guests, booked nearly 100,000 room nights at partner hotels, and redeemed more than \$4.4 million in meals at partner restaurants. It has truly established itself as one of the Midwest's premier gaming destinations!

JACK Entertainment is a Midwest-based urban gaming company focused on the development and operation of gaming facilities that are designed to maximize connectivity and economic impact in the local areas where they reside. MSPT CANTERBURY PARK \$350 REGIONAL EVENT \$100K GTD SET FOR AUGUST 7-11

innesota's Canterbury Park, home to the first-ever MSPT event, is gearing up for another record-breaking tournament. From August 7-11, the MSPT will be in Shakopee, Minnesota for a \$350 buy-in, \$100,000 GTD Regional Event.

A series of \$50 and \$90 satellites will feed into the Regional, which will run August 7-11. The tournament will offer four flights starting with Day 1A at 5 p.m. on Wednesday, August 7. Day 1B will take place at the same time on Thursday, August 8, while 1C and 1D will be at 12 p.m. on Friday, August 9 and Saturday, August 10 respectively. The remaining players from each flight will combine on Sunday morning at 11 a.m. and play until a champion is crowned.

Seating is limited as there is a max of 20 available tables, so alternates are a possibility. Be sure to register early to lock up a seat.

The upcoming MSPT Canterbury Regional, the third ever held at the venue, will be the 33rd Regional Event since their inception at the beginning of 2015. The Regional Events are designed to offer players the opportunity to play MSPT's lauded "Chainsaw-Approved" \$1,100 Main Event structure at a more affordable price point.

Last year, the second-ever MSPT \$350 Regional Event held at Canterbury Park attracted 1,065 entrants, and it was 2016 MNPokerMag POY Saad Ghanem who captured a \$39,542 first-place prize and the MSPT hardware after a three-way chop. Ghanem, AJ Thompson and Paul Cross negotiated an even split of the top three payouts which were scheduled to pay \$57,151, \$35,216 and \$26,258 respectively. For Cross it was a back-to-back top three finish in this event.

In 2017, 32-year-old Paul Cross topped a record field of 1,169 entries—the largest tournament in Minnesota history—to win a \$61,911 first-place prize.

Recently, Canterbury Park renovated their card room, gaming pits, restaurant options and entrance to the Track Level. In addition Canterbury unveiled a \$400-million redevelopment plan that would facilitate the development of restaurants, hotels, entertainment, offices, medical, retail and commercial recreational uses. Plans include an extended-stay hotel, boutique hotel, hotel and water park, an office space, new restaurants, specialty options, family entertainment venues and more. The live part includes a luxury apartment

complex, upscale townhomes and a senior housing co-op. The vision for the redevelopment is a place to "live, stay, work, play."

Canterbury Park Racetrack and Card Casino is Minnesota's only thoroughbred and quarter horse racing facility. There is also year-round wagering on simulcast horse racing and hosts a variety of other entertainment and special events at its facility.

Through popular promotions and big-money tournaments Canterbury's Card Casino has become a Twin Cities' gaming destination.

MSPT RETURNS TO MAJESTIC STAR CASINO AUGUST 16-18

or the fourth time ever, the MSPT is headed to Majestic Star Casino in the East Chicagoland area (Gary, Indiana) from August 16-18.

A series of \$65 and \$250 satellites will feed into the \$1,100 buy-in MSPT154 Main Event, which requires

players be 21+ to play. That tournament, which will offer a \$200K GTD, will offer two starting flights starting with Day 1A at 3 p.m. on Friday, August 16. Day 1B will take place at the same time on Saturday, August 17. The surviving players from both flights will then return at 11 a.m. on Sunday, August 18 to play down to a winner.

Also, on that Sunday there will be a \$340 NLH Last Chance Casino Bonus Event beginning at Noon.

In January of this year, Mike Shin of Milwaukee, WI topped

a field of 309-entrants which eclipsed the largest field of 301 at the property. Shin walked away with the \$68,593 top prize! The win was the second largest of Shin's career after the \$427,930 he received for finishing 12th in the 2016 WSOP Main Event.

"I feel awesome, man! I don't know what else to say." Shin said after his victory. "I try not to miss these events, especially in this region."


The MSPT first visited Majestic Star back in March 2014 (Season 5) when Ken Baime topped a field of 301 entrants to win the title for \$77,681. Five months later, the tour returned to the venue and saw Brian Zimcosky top a 228-entry field to win \$61,870.

GARY LOWE WINS \$350 REGIONAL MAIN EVENT AT TROPICANA EVANSVILLE

he MSPT was back at Tropicana Evansville May 22-26 with our popular Regional Series format for the which included a \$250 Tag Team, \$125 Seniors (50+) and a \$125 Turbo Deepstack and was capped off with the popular \$350 Regional Main Event.

The \$250 Tag Team event kicked off the series on

Wednesday, May 22 and attracted 199 total entrants. In the end it was Patrick Nordhoff & Stu Holland that earned the win, splitting the \$5,970 first place prize.

On Thursday, May 23, 161 total runners came out to participate in the \$125 MSPT Seniors (50+) Championship. Donald Williams navigated the difficult field to take home the \$4,347 first place prize.

James Aldridge took down the \$125 Turbo Deepstack on Friday, May 24 by outlasting a field of 69 entrants. Aldridge pocketed \$2,415 for the win.

Gary Lowe of Linton, IN won the \$350 Regional Main Event by defeating a 473-entrant field to take home \$29,372. For Lowe this was his first ever MSPT cash and his largest career score.

Event Recap

MSPT VENETIAN MID-SEASON CHAMPIONSHIP ATTRACTS 4,345 RUNNERS!

The \$1,100 buy-in, \$3 million Guaranteed MSPT Mid-Season Championship at The Venetian attracted 4,345 runners, which made it the second-largest poker tournament in both MSPT and Venetian history!

On Day 3, the final 21 players returned to play down to a winner. After six hours, it was retired attorney turned business investor Mazen Abdallah of New Orleans, Louisiana who walked away with a \$445,000 first-place prize after a four-way chop (the original first-place prize was slated to be \$540,116)

"I feel amazing!" Abdallah said after his victory. "I came out here specifically for this tournament, I flew in from Houston, Texas to come here. I told my wife I came here for one thing and one thing only, and that's to win this goddamn tournament, and that's what I did!"

Abdallah, who was a charismatic force at the table, had a unique way of describing his play style. "My style is a little bit off; a combination of game theory, but also anti-game theory. Create chaos, but always be in control at the same time. And the number one edge that I have is my table talk. I influence a lot of action through my words. It's because I convince myself of the strength of my hand, and it conveys through my speech."

Abdallah's victory was also unique in that he doesn't have a lot of prior tournament experience; "I don't normally play tournaments, this is probably the sixth tournament I've ever played in my life. The thing is, it's so hard to make it to the very end of a tournament. You can spend six, seven days and walk away with nothing. To have a couple prop bets with a buddy of yours, to where if you do make it, it's worthwhile. I don't wanna go into too many details, but every tournament I've ever played is based on a prop bet. Earlier this year, I had a prop bet on the first WSOP event I ever played, a \$1,350 High Roller at the Hard Rock, and the only reason I played it was because of that prop bet." He ended up shipping that event for the ring and \$31,500.

Coming into the final day, Abdallah had a premonition about his eventual victory. "I had this overwhelming feeling, I'm gonna win this. I was telling everybody over and over again. Buddy of mine that made Day 3, (2018 WSOP Main Event Final Tablist) Aram Zobian, amazing player, he gave me some advice and tips on the later stages of the tournament. Ultimately what he told me was - Play your game, don't

change it. Play your game, maintain it, that's what got you there."

Abdallah also doesn't plan to keep much of the winnings he accrued but has noble intentions in mind, saying, "I have to say this; my wife does not allow me to keep any money I win from poker. So basically it's either going to charity or people who are in need. I told her we're gonna splurge on one thing, though, and she agreed!


Day 2 saw a number of notables cash, including Reg Powell (24th - \$21,182), Season 7 MSPT Canterbury Park champ Jonathan Kim (29th - \$14,404), last year's runner-up Felipe Davila (36th - \$14,404), WSOP bracelet winner Jessica Dawley (50th - \$10,591), former MSPT champ Josh Reichard (63rd - \$9,320), Season 9 MSPT Venetian champ Sam Vizza (125th - \$5,423), Season 6 MSPT POY Mark Hodge (200th - \$4,152), Season 8 MSPT Potawatomi Regional champ Craig Trost (212th - \$4,152), Season 9 MSPT Michigan State Poker champ Matthew Stammen (361st - \$2,711), MSPT Hall of Famer Rich Alsup (366th - \$2,711), and former WSOP November Niners Bryan Piccioli (391st - \$2,372) and Jeremy Ausmus (392nd - \$2,372).

Day 3 saw 11 players fall short of making the final table, including final table bubble boy Thaun Lam (11th - \$42,364), Dustin Lee (13th - \$36,009), Scott Hall (15th - \$36,009), Erik Glenister (18th - \$29,655) and 2018 WSOP Main Event Final Tablist Aram Zobian (20th - \$25,418).

Final Table Action

Julien Loire went out on one of the very first hands of the final table, getting his last seven big blinds in with king-queen against the eights of Jesse Jaurigue. Loire failed to improve and hit the rail in tenth, \$42,364 richer. A few levels later, Fernando Arajuo was felted in another flip, when his sevens couldn't fade the king-jack of Mazen Abdallah. Arajuo took \$50,837 home for his ninth-place finish.



big blinds in a short time later in a blind-versus-blind battle, but Jaruigue held Big Slick and ended Sinawi's run in eighth-place for \$63,546. Another blind battle would end Nitis Udornpim's tournament in seventh-place, when he ripped king-six right into Sheddy Siddiqui's jacks, giving Udornpim

a \$80,941 consolation prize.

Abdallah claimed his next victim when the start of Day 3 chip leader Matthew Sesso got his king-queen in against the ace-deuce of Abdallah, and Sesso failed to improve, leaving him with sixth-place and \$108,028. Jaurigue was the last player to fall, when he called off his last ten big blinds with sevens, only to find Michael Shelton had him crushed with queens. Jaurigue finished in fifth for \$148,273.

Strategy presented by Jonathan Little

FACING A FOUR-BET WITH POCKET NINES

Day 1c of May's record-breaking MSPT Fire-Keepers, it was Level 14 with the blinds at 1,500/3,000/3,000 when the UTG+1 player raised to 9,000 and Scotter Clark three-bet all in for 14,000 total.

Jim Duda (140,000) then four-bet to 25,000 and called when the UTG+1 player jammed for 65,000.

Duda: A♥J♥ UTG+1: 9♥9♠ Clark: 5♦5♥

The board ran out 8♦A♦4♠A♠5♠ and Clark rivered a full house to triple up while Duda claimed the side pot with trip aces to chip up to 200,000.

We caught up with poker pro Jonathan Little of Poker-Coaching.com, the official training site of the MSPT, to ask him a few questions.

MSPT: What do you make of Duda's four-bet here with acejack suited? Good idea or better off to flat/fold?

Little: This is a difficult spot to analyze because it depends entirely on the ranges and tendencies of the other two players in the hand, which are impossible to know. In general, though, due to UTG+1's shallow stack, I think Duda should either four-bet larger (to induce UTG+1 to fold) or fold. If UTG+1 is a loose, splashy player, I like four-betting, but if he has been reasonably snug, folding is probably ideal. If Clack was known to be extremely tight, Duda should also fold. If everyone plays reasonable ranges though, four-betting due to having a decent amount of equity plus fold equity is probably ideal.

If you were in the UTG+1 player's shoes what would you have done with the nines when facing a four-bet?

Little: Facing the four-bet, I would have folded. For Duda to four-bet, he needs either a premium pair or a strong high-card hand, resulting in 9x9x being at a disadvantage. It is easy to figure out if you are in good shape or not against a range by asking how many hands you dominate and how many hands dominate you. In this spot, pocket nines are losing to all bigger pairs and presumably worse pairs would not four-bet, so nines are not in great shape.

What do you make of Duda's call after the UTG+1 player five-

bet jammed? How do ranges factor in a spot like this?

Little: Against an all-in, I would still fold for the same reason. While some players will only min-four-bet with exactly their best hands and go all-in with their marginal hands, many players are figuring out that it is usually not the ideal strategy because it clearly splits their range, making them easy to play against. So, either way, facing the small all-in and four-bet, I would have folded pocket nines.

Event Preview

MSPT HEADS TO TROPICANA EVANSVILLE AUGUST 23-25 FOR 2019 INDIANA STATE POKER CHAMPIONSHIP

eason 10 of the MSPT has included two Regional Series at Tropicana Evansville in southern Indiana back in early February and May, now we're headed there again from August 23-25. However, this time it'll be for the \$1,100 buy-in, \$200,000 GTD 2019 MSPT Indiana State Poker Championship.

For nearly 22 years, Tropicana Evansville operated as Indiana's first riverboat casino, and now they've become the first to transition to a land-based casino with their new 75,000 square-foot facility.

The 2019 MSPT Indiana State Poker Championship will kick off with Day 1A at 3 p.m. on Friday, August 23 with the plan of playing 15 levels. Day 1B will then take place at the same time on Saturday, August 24. Players who advance from Main Event Flight 1A to Day 2 are not eligible to play in Flight 1B without forfeiting their chips. The remaining players from each flight will combine on Sunday, August 25 at 11:00 a.m. and play until a champion is crowned. The complete schedule can be found on msptpoker.com.

The final table will be broadcast LIVE (15-minute delay) worldwide on msptpoker.com using RFID technology allowing all viewers to see the hole cards. In addition, the entire Main Event will be live reported in the MSPT live blog.

It'll mark the sixth time a Main Event has been held at Tropicana Evansville, the second in the new land-based facility. The 2018 MSPT Indiana State Poker Championship attracted 307 entries to Tropicana Evansville, which sits on the Ohio River just across the border from Kentucky. After a full weekend of play, Tim Burden of Central City, Kentucky walked away with the title and \$68,149 top prize, his first ever MSPT cash.

In August 2017, the 2017 MSPT Indiana State Poker Championship drew 320 entries and saw Satish Thakur claim the title and \$71,047 top prize.

In 2016, Earl Potter bested a 340-entry field to win the 2016 MSPT Indiana State Poker Championship for \$82,450. Other winners of the MSPT Tropicana Evansville include Michael O'Neill (August 2015 for \$67,746) and Charlie Dawson (August 2014 for \$60,527).

Tropicana Evansville is a multi-million-dollar entertainment complex located on the scenic banks of the Ohio River in southwestern Indiana. The single-level 24-hour casino, which opened on October 20, 2017, encompasses 45,000 square feet

of gaming space featuring 1,175 slot games, 33 table games, a dedicated Poker Room and a High Limit Room.

Accommodations include a 243-room hotel tower and a 95-room boutique hotel. The property showcases an ultramodern entertainment lounge, five dining options, five bars, gift shop, conference center, riverfront pavilion and a 1,660-vehicle attached parking garage.
